RESULTS OF THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

TOWN OF CRANBERRY ISLES

MARCH 16TH, 2019

The meeting was called to order at the Community Center on Great Cranberry Island at 9:00 am by the Town Clerk, Denise McCormick.

Richard Beal made a motion to adjourn the meeting and move it to the Congregational Church on Great Cranberry Island, seconded by Melissa Amuso. Unanimous Vote to Approve.

At 9:05 am, Denise McCormick, Town Clerk, called the Town Meeting to order at the Cranberry Island Congregational Church to act on the following Articles:

1. 1. To elect by ballot a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Sheila Krasnow nominated Barbara Fernald.

- 2. To elect by ballot a Town Clerk for the ensuing year and to vote compensation.

Kaitlyn Duggan nominated Denise McCormick.

Serena Spurling motioned to set compensation for the year at \$7,000, seconded by Tammy Palmer.

Unanimous Vote to Approve.

3. To see if the voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles will approve the use of the Maine Municipal Association's recommended Maine Moderator's Manual "Rules of Procedures" for the conduct of this Town Meeting.

Amy Palmer motioned to Approve, seconded by James Amuso. Unanimous Vote to Approve.

4. To see if the voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles will approve opening the floor of this Town Meeting to all non-registered persons for the purpose of discussion only on each of the following articles of this 2019 warrant.

Kelly Sanborn motioned to Approve, seconded by Richard Alley, Jr. Unanimous vote to Approve.

5. To elect by ballot a Selectman for the term of three years.

(Term expiring: Richard Beal)

Sheila Krasnow nominated Richard Beal.

6. To vote compensation for all the Selectmen for the ensuing year.

Nanette Hadlock motioned to set compensation at recommended \$8,000 & 7,500, seconded by Sheila Krasnow.

7. To elect by ballot a Town Treasurer for the ensuing year and to vote compensation.

James Amuso nominated Denise McCormick.

Unanimous Vote to Approve.

8. To elect by ballot a Collector of Taxes and Collector of Excise Taxes for the ensuing year and to vote compensation.

Kelly Sanborn nominated Denise McCormick.

5 Votes Cast for Denise McCormick.

Kaitlyn Duggan motioned to approve compensation of \$28,000, seconded Amy Palmer. Unanimous Vote to Approve.

9. To elect by ballot a member of the Superintending School Committee for a term of three years.

(Term expiring: Amy Palmer).

Barbara Meyers nominated Amy Palmer Serena Spurling nominated Katherine Morse-Fernald Hannah Folsom nominated Tammy Palmer.

44 Votes Cast, 23 Votes Amy Palmer, 16 Votes Katherine Morse-Fernald, 5 Votes Tammy Palmer.

Amy Palmer wins by the majority.

10. To vote the hourly rate of pay for Town Officials and Employees

Sheila Krasnow motioned to approve \$18 to \$35 per hour, seconded by Bruce Fernald.

Carl Brooks motioned to Amend the amounts to \$12 to \$35 per hour, seconded by James Amuso.

30 Votes Cast to Amend, 22 Votes Yes, 8 Votes No.

Unanimous vote to Approve Article.

11. To see if the voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles will vote to collect interest at the rate of Nine Percent (9%) APR on all 2019 taxes not paid by December 01, 2019. Municipalities may, by vote, determine the rate of interest that shall apply to taxes that become delinquent during taxable year 2019 until those taxes are paid in full. The maximum rate of interest that can be charged per Title 36, MRSA §505.4 is nine percent (9%) APR.

Majority Vote to Approve 9%, 1 Vote to Oppose.

12. To see if the voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles will vote to allow a two percent (2%) discount on all taxes which are paid in full within thirty (30) days of the date shown on the original bill as submitted by the Tax Collector.
