NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS IMPORTANT


ALL TAXPAYERS SHOULD READ THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS AND COMPLY WITH THEM

Section 70, Chapter 13, Revised Statutes of Maine, 1930

"Before making an assessment, the Assessors shall give seasonable notice in writing to the Inhabitants, by posting notifications in some public place in Town, or shall notify them, in such other ways as the Town at its Annual Meeting directs, to make and bring in to them true and perfect lists of their polls and all their estates, real and personal, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the first day of April of the same year. If any resident owner after such notice, does not bring in such lists, he is thereby barred of his right to make application to the Assessors or the County Commissioners for any abatement of his taxes, unless he offers such lists with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to offer it at the time appointed.

THROUGH THE YEARS

This, our twenty-ninth printed annual Town Report, marks the one hundred sixth anniversary of the Town of Cranberry Isles.

Frenchman's Bay, with its many beautiful islands, may well be called a paradise for the yachtsman. Five of these beautiful islands comprise our little town.

From our northern shore, one's eye is met by the picturesque Mount Desert hills, which are about three miles away, with a greater height than any mountains on the Atlantic coast. This skyline is equalled by few and excelled by none.

Although Cranberry Isles has a relatively small population, it has many distinctive features. There are three postoffices, namely, Cranberry Isles, established May 9, 1847, with William P. Preble, postmaster; Islesford, established August 15, 1884, with Agnes Hadlock, postmaster; Sutton, established March 17, 1898, with Clara A. Rice, postmaster.

The Coast Guard Station at Islesford was established 1879, and for many years the crew consisted entirely of townspeople. At present the crew is made up wholly of men from other towns, although most of them have taken their residence here.

There are two government lighthouses located in the town, one at Baker's Island, and the other at Bear Island.

A cordial invitation is extended to all to visit our town and enjoy the beautiful scenery. Transportation is always available from Southwest Harbor, and during the summer season from both the Rock End and Clifton docks at Northeast Harbor, and from Acadia Pier at Seal Harbor.

Cranberry Isles has an area of approximately one and one-fifth square miles or 771 41-80 square acres, as follows:



Islesford, 33 pupils; G. C. I., 29 pupils; total of 62 pupils. This is a gain of 2 pupils over last year; also a gain in Islesford of 11, or 33 1-3 per cent., and a loss in G. C. I. of 9, or 25 per cent.

New modern Arithmetic, English and supplementary books have been added and all supplies necessary for a well-equipped school room have been added.

A new Course of Study, to be used in conjunction with the State Course, has been placed in the teachers' hands. This course, I believe, will make our schools still more efficient.

The Islesford school has been thoroughly painted inside and the desks repaired, varnished and painted, These two rooms present a very attractive appearance in modern school colors, thus doing away with old-fashioned dark colors which made it necessary to keep the lights on most of the day. Again, new light bulbs have been installed in both schools. These bulbs, called twilight or daylight bulbs, take away the glare and thus relieve the children of so much eyestrain.

I recommend that the G. C. I. school be painted inside the same as the Islesford school.

Six students are taking higher education, as follows: Southwest Harbor, 3; Gilman high, 1; Coburn Classical Institute, 1; Ellsworth, 1.

In closing, I wish to heartily thank the superintending school committee and citizens for their hearty cooperation and support during the year.


To the Voters of the Town of Cranberry Isles:



- 22 To see if the town will vote and authorize the school committee to employ a school physician, and raise a sum of money for same.

- 23 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs and maintenance of public wharf and float.
- 24 To see if the town will vote to appoint a caretaker of public wharf and act thereon.
- 25 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to renew wharf permit of Eber L. Spurling for a term of one year, at \$25.00, and act thereon.
- 26 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$80.00 for superintendent of schools' office rent.
- 27 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for superintendent of schools' salary.
- 28 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for maintenance of State-aid highway, according to the provisions of sections 9, 18, 36 and 37, chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of Maine, and specify amount of each island.
- 29 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for street lights.
- 30 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest on notes.
- 31 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay on principal of note.
- 32 To see if the town will vote to paint schoolrooms, G. C. I., and raise a sum of money for same.
- 33 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise, for extermination of mosquitoes, and to whom paid.
- 34 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to make temporary loan, or loans, not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$4,000, in anticipation of and to be paid out of the current taxes for the municipal year of 1937.
- 35 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to issue the town's negotiable notes or bonds in a sum not exceeding \$6,000.00, for the purpose of refunding, renewing or paying certain indebtedness of the town due now or to become due during the year of 1937, to wit:

- First National Bank of Bar Harbor, not for \$1,000.00, due April 14, 1937.
- Arthur M. Spurling, note for \$2,000.00, due July 1, 1937.
- Leslie M. Rice, note for \$2,000.00 due July 1, 1937. Bar Harbor Banking & Trust Co., note for \$1,000.00,
- Bar Harbor Banking & Trust Co., note for \$1,000.00 due Oct 1, 1937.
- 36 To see if the town will vote to join the Maine Municipal Association, annual service charge, \$15.00.
- 37 To see if the town will vote to elect a fire warden, according to section 6 of chapter 35 of the Revised Statutes of Maine.
- 38 To see if the town will vote, and set a date for hanging and removing town float.
- 39 To see if the town will vote to purchase suitable material for laying dust on its roads, and act thereon.
- 40 To see if the town will vote to abate any part of unpaid taxes for the following years: 1926-1928-1931-1932-1933-1934.
- 41 To see if the town will vote to buy snow plow for Little Cranberry Island, and raise a sum of money for same.
- 42 To choose a town auditor for the ensuing year.
- 43 To see if the town will vote to adopt a town seal.
- 44 To see if the town will vote to pay E. G. Bunker the sum of \$27.00 for mothers' aid supplies, furnished January, 1936.
- 45 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
- 46 To vote pay of moderator for his services.

The selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of correcting the list of voters in said town, and hearing and deciding on applications of those claiming the right to have their names upon said list, at Town Hall, Great Cranberry Island, in said town at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.
