

Board of Selectmen's Meeting Minutes Tuesday, August 04, 2009 Islesford Neighborhood House

- I. Call to order: 8:30 P.M. by Chairman Richard Beal.
- II. Review / Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

Dan Lief moves to accept the July 07, 2009 Board of Selectmen's Meeting Minutes as written. Richard Beal seconds the motion, with a unanimous vote by Sally Rowan. **Motion passes.**

III. Review / Signing Financial Warrants

Warrant # 32: \$ 5228.78 Warrant # 33: \$ 5097.93 Warrant # 34: \$ 31699.42 Warrant # 35: \$ 208486.96 Total: \$ 250513.09 All warrants were signed by the Selectmen.

IV. Old Business

i. Road Repair Bid Documents

Bid specs are in for pothole repairs on sections of roads at Islesford and Great Cranberry Island. In the next couple of days the Facilities Supervisor will be doing surveys to obtain specified details of what repairs are needed. The bid specs call for all labor, materials, equipment and transportation necessary for the repairs. Included in the bid specs is a statement allowing for a 5% room for change orders if necessary. Work outside this range shall be treated as a change order and the Town will negotiate with the Contractor to determine the costs. Pay requests must be received no less than five business days prior to a Selectmen's Meeting to be placed on the financial warrant. Payments will be disbursed following approval at Selectmen's Meetings only. Application deadline will be September 01, 2009 and completion deadline is October 04, 2009.

ii. Sutton Island

Sutton Island Residents have voiced their need for replacement of the boards on the path to the four corners. Estimates by the Facilities Supervisor for the work are \$2500.00 in materials and \$2500.00 in labor. This project is expected to be ready for next year. Some concerns are voiced about private ownership of the property where the repairs are to take place. Selectman Beal suggests that the Town receive a written easement from the three abutting landowners granting rights to cross their properties for repairs. Selectman Beal also suggests that the trash shelter needs repair at Sutton Island. The Town Office Staff, Richard Beal, Sally Rowan, and Margaret Blank will be attending the Association for the Preservation of Sutton Island annual meeting on Thursday, August 04, 2009 where items of interest to Sutton Residents will be discussed. Twice weekly trash pickup will be scheduled for the rest of the summer season. Phil Whitney suggests that research be done on ownership of paths at Sutton. Selectman Beal suggests contacting James Sewall Company in order to obtain photo map overlays for years between 1900 and 1920.

iii. Road Forums August 26th and 27th

Forums for public input on levels of service wanted for each road and road sections will be held at Great Cranberry on August 26 and at Islesford on August 27, 2009. A Comprehensive Plan public review workshop will be held on Great Cranberry on August 26, at 4:00 P.M., right before the Road Forum. The Islesford Comp Plan workshop will be held on August 26 at 4:45 P.M. Meeting dates and times to be posted soon. Selectman Beal reminds residents that the speed limit on Town roads is 25 miles per hour, unless changed by the Board of Selectmen.

C. Transportation Committee Update (Taken out of order)

Ron Axelrod and Kate Fernald present the findings and recommendations for service between the Town of Cranberry Isles and Mount Desert Island. Also presented are the results of a Docks and Harbors Safety Study to identify improvements that will make year round early morning and evening boat landings safer and more accessible. The Transportation Committee recommends safety improvements at our docks, regardless of whether a schedule change should take place or not. Selectman Beal recommends that the Harbor Committee and Municipal Advisory Commission meet to help with prioritizing issues. Richard Beal offers to meet with Beal and Bunker to discuss the

recommendations. The Town Clerk will obtain advice from legal counsel about whether it would be possible to hold executive session for all Selectmen to be able to meet with Beal and Bunker.

E. TEPA Update (Taken out of order)

In reference to the Transportation Enhancement Project Agreement, the Town will be contacted about the possibility of borrowing funds in anticipation of the funds coming for replacement of barge ramps at Islesford and Great Cranberry. This would require a special Town Meeting for voter approval. No date has been set for such a meeting at this time.

D. TCI Video / Information Brochure

The idea of obtaining a video for TCI information and assets has been dropped by the Selectmen at this time.

B. Comp Plan Update (Taken out of order)

Hearings for public input on the proposed comprehensive plan have been scheduled as follows:

F. Baker Island Light

Selectman Beal will write a "Thank you, but we are not interested" letter to the Government Services Administration in regard to obtaining Baker Island Light. Hugh Dwelley, President of the Islesford Historical Society visited Baker Island Light with GSA recently and reaffirmed that the light tower is seriously deteriorating. Mr. Robinson of GCI will write a letter on behalf of the Town of Cranberry Isles to Senator Collins in regard to the lack of maintenance by the USCG of Baker Island Light.

G. Proposed Interlocal Agreement

The Board of Selectmen has decided to reject participation in a proposed interlocal Agreement for General Assistance Fair Hearing Authority. The proposed agreement would require that our Town General Assistance Administrator be made available for other participating Towns' General Assistance appeals. The Town Clerk will write a letter of decision.

In reference to the lease for parking at Northeast Harbor, it is reported that the current lease with the Town of Mount Desert will expire in 2012. Selectman Beal suggests that the dialog needs to be opened up with Mount Desert for renewal of a lease, and what, if any, effects will be in reference to their proposed marina plan which includes plans for a parking structure where our current lot is. Richard Beal and Eric Dyer will look into parking at Northeast Harbor.

H. Marsh Lease

Dan Lief moves to authorize Richard Beal to sign the Marsh lease on behalf of the Selectmen after review by the attorney. Sally Rowan seconds the motion, with a unanimous vote by Richard Beal. **Motion passes.**

V. New Business

A. Signing of Septic Sludge Removal Contract 2009-2010

The Board of Selectmen signs a contract with Haslam Septic Service of Lamoine, ME for disposal of septic sludge generated within the borders of the Town of Cranberry Isles. The contract is in effect from July01, 2009 until June 30, 2010 for the cost of \$380.00.

B. Signing of URIP Certificate 2009-2010

The Board of Selectmen signs a certification for receiving Rural Initiative Funds for the use only for capitol improvement of public roads. Payments from URIP are received quarterly and it is estimated that Cranberry Isles will receive \$8508.00.

C. MSW Contract Adjustment

Eric Dyer and Selectman Lief will work on re-negotiations regarding the Base Amount adjustment for the average annual tonnage of municipal solid waste. The adjustment shall take place on December 31, 2009.

D. Town Field Use

In reference to questions about the use of Islesford Town Field, it has been determined by the landscaper that the sod is still not ready for use this season, but is expected to be fine for next summer's use. Signs are posted and the field has been roped off for the 2009 summer season. Many inquiries have been placed in reference to use of the field.

E. APSI Meeting

Town Office staff and Selectmen, as well as the EMT Directors have been invited to attend the annual meeting of the Association for the Preservation of Sutton Island on Thursday, August 06, 2009. This will be a chance to meet with Sutton Island Residents and to listen to any needs that the Residents may have for the upcoming budget.

Defibrillators are now posted at two locations on Sutton Island, outside under glass cover for emergency use. Maps have been given to the Town with each Sutton Island Residence and numbers.

Richard Beal reports that each year Acadia National Park has been sharing emergency equipment with the Fire Departments, and he suggests that some of the equipment be shared with Sutton Island.

VI. Other Business

- Richard Beal nominates Janice Smith Murch as Harbor Committee Alternate Member.
 - Sally Rowan moves to appoint Janice Smith Murch as Harbor Committee Alternate. Richard Beal seconds the motion, with a unanimous vote by Dan Lief. **Motion passes.**
- A citizen request has been received asking that bicycles not be allowed to operate
 on the Town Docks. In the past there were signs on the docks that suggested this
 rule. It can be very dangerous with bikes, pedestrians, and vehicles using the
 docks at the same time. Selectman Beal also mentions the danger of running on
 the docks. Occasionally bicycles are left blocking the passageway for boaters
 unloading freight. The Facilities Supervisor will make signs, and Selectman
 Rowan will help with the language.
- Selectman Beal has requested a visit from a Hancock County Sheriff's Deputy to visit both Great Cranberry and Islesford to enforce vehicle registration.
- Submerged land leases for both docks and both barge ramps at Great Cranberry and Islesford have expired. The Facilities Supervisor is in the process of applying for a renewal of the leases.

- A Permit By Rule Notification Form has been sent to the Department of Environmental Protection for approval of replacement for barge ramps at Great Cranberry Island and Islesford. Other elements of the project, (dolphin piles and Manset Gangway) will require full permit applications.
- The Facilities Supervisor will contact the Town Attorney in reference to the possible violation of riparian rights with the Brown Float near the TCI barge ramp at Manset.

VII. Audience Communications

Clayton Bright brings to attention that the July Selectmen's Meeting minutes are
not yet posted on the municipal website. The Deputy Clerk will follow through
with this task. Mr. Bright asks if a policy could be set for a five day deadline after
a meeting for minutes to be posted online. Selectman Lief responds that within
two weeks is a reasonable time limit. Meeting Minutes are posted in draft form
until accepted by the Board itself at the following meeting.
