# Results of the Annual Town Meeting, March 08, 2010

The Annual Town Meeting was held at the Neighborhood House on Islesford, on March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2010. The meeting was called to order at 8:30 am by Denise McCormick, Town Clerk.

The articles were voted on as follows:

1. To elect by ballot a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Barbara Stainton nominated Barbara Fernald. 5 Votes Cast, 5 Votes Barbara Fernald.

The Moderator took the oath of office, and continued with the meeting.

2. To elect by ballot a Town Clerk for the ensuing year and to vote compensation.

Daniel Lief nominated Denise McCormick. 7 Votes Cast, 7 Votes Denise McCormick.

Barbara Stainton motions to set compensation at \$6,825, seconded by Richard Beal. Unanimous vote to approve.

The Moderator swore the Town Clerk in, and continued with the meeting.

3. To see if the voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles will approve use of the Maine Municipal Association's recommended Maine Moderator's Manual "Rules of Procedures" for the conduct of this Town Meeting.

Bruce Fernald motions to approve, seconded by Richard Beal. Unanimous vote to approve.

4. To see if the voters of the Town of Cranberry Isles will approve opening the floor of this Town Meeting to all non-registered persons for the purpose of discussion only on each of the following articles of this 2010 warrant.

Barbara Stainton motions to approve, seconded by Anna Fernald. Unanimous vote to approve.

5. To elect by ballot a Selectman for the term of three years.

Malcolm Donald nominated Richard Beal.

9 Votes Cast, 8 Votes Richard Beal, 1 Vote spoiled.

6. To vote compensation for all Selectmen for the ensuing year.

Bruce Fernald motions to set compensation at \$1700 for Chairman and \$1400. for others, seconded by Barbara Stainton.

Unanimous vote to approve.

7. To elect by ballot a Town Treasurer for the ensuing year and to vote compensation.

Nanette Hadlock nominated Denise McCormick.

10 Votes Cast, 10 Votes Denise McCormick.

Barbara Stainton motions to set compensation at \$9,975, seconded by Richard Beal. Unanimous vote to approve.

8. To elect by ballot a Collector of Taxes and Collector of Excise Taxes for the ensuing year and to vote compensation.

Daniel Lief nominated Denise McCormick.

10 Votes Cast, 10 Votes Denise McCormick.

Barbara Stainton motions to set compensation at \$25,725, seconded by Kelly Sanborn. Unanimous vote to approve.

9. To elect by ballot a member of the Superintending School Committee for a term of three years.

Malcolm Donald nominated Barbara Meyers.

Iann Krasnow nominated Katelyn Damon.

Beverly Sanborn nominated Kelly Sanborn. Kelly Sanborn declined the nomination.

- 10. To elect by ballot a member of the Superintending School Committee for a term of one year to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Katherine Chaplin.

- 11. To elect by ballot two members of the Shellfish Conservation Committee for a term of three years.

12. To elect by ballot three members of the Municipal Advisory Commission, which consists of seven elected volunteer property owners or registered voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles, who shall serve a period of three years each.

13. To vote the hourly rate of pay for Town Officials and Employees.

Barbara Stainton motions to set the hourly rate at \$12 to 25 per hour. Seconded by Richard Beal.

Unanimous vote to approve.

14. To see if the voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles will vote to collect interest at the rate of 7% APR on all 2010 taxes not paid by December 01, 2010. Municipalities may, by vote, determine the rate of interest that shall apply to taxes that become delinquent during the taxable year 2010 until those taxes are paid in full. The maximum rate of interest that can be charged per Title 36, MRSA§505.4 is seven percent (7%).

Bruce Fernald motions to approve, seconded by Barbara Stainton. Unanimous vote to approve.

15. To see if the voters of the Town of Cranberry Isles will vote to allow a two percent (2%) discount on all taxes which are paid in full within thirty (30) days of the date shown on the original bill as submitted by the Tax Collector.

Ruth Westphal motions to approve, seconded by Barbara Stainton. Unanimous vote to approve.

16. To see if the voters of the Town of Cranberry Isles will vote to authorize the Treasurer to expend funds in January 2011, February 2011, and March 2011 equal to aggregate to three twelfths (3/12ths) of the Operations Budget approved for the Year

2010. This authorization will permit the Treasurer to prepare Financial Warrants for approval by the Board of Selectmen, prepare checks, and legally pay bills pending approval of the entire Operations Budget by the Voters in March 2011.

18. To see if the voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles will vote to authorize the municipal officers to spend up to \$46,000 for an early/late commuter ferry service for the first year of a two year trial period, beginning September 2010.

19. To see if the voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles will vote to authorize the Municipal Officers to borrow up to two hundred fifty thousand dollars (250,000) for a Capital Roads Project for Great Cranberry Island and Islesford.

Victoria Johnston motions to amend the article to read "...borrow up to one hundred thirty thousand dollars (\$130,000) for a Capital Roads Project...", seconded by William Dowling. Unanimous vote to amend the amount.

20. To see if the voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles will vote to authorize the Municipal Officers to enter into a contract for a Fire Protection Study for the Fire and Emergency Medical Services of the Cranberry Isles and to authorize spending up to \$6000 (six thousand dollars).

21. To see if the voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles will appropriate and authorize the Board of Selectmen to expend up to six thousand dollars (\$6,000) for a feasibility study and design work to be performed by Kleinschmidt Associates, to investigate and develop options for the extension of the Town Dock at Islesford.

Sally Rowan motions to approve, seconded by Ruth Westphal. Unanimous vote to approve.

22. To see if the voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles will vote to repeal an Ordinance entitled "Vehicle Waste Disposal Fee Ordinance", which was initially enacted at the March 2004 Cranberry Isles Town Meeting.

Daniel Lief motions to approve, seconded by Bruce Fernald.

After a lengthy discussion of the pros and cons of the Ordianance and repealing it, Jason Pickering motions to call the question, seconded by Kelly Sanborn.

42 Written Votes Cast, 14 Yes, 28 No.

Ordinance remains.

23. To see if the voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles will vote to allow the installation of a subsurface sewage disposal field on Town-owned land at the Islesford Town Field, and performance of any attendant roadwork to link the system with the Islesford Neighborhood House, which is to be served by the system. The system will be constructed entirely at the expense of the Islesford Neighborhood House Association, which will provide the Town with full indemnification for work done on Town roads and in the Town Field.

Daniel Lief motions to approve, seconded by Richard Beal Unanimous vote to approve.

24. To see if the voters of the Town of Cranberry Isles will vote to enact an "Ordinance For the Retention or Disposition of Tax Acquired Property In the Town Of Cranberry Isles".

Richard Beal motions to approve, seconded by Ruth Westphal. Unanimous vote to approve.

25. To see if the voters of the Town Of Cranberry Isles will authorize the Selectmen to sign and enter into a five (5) year contract with Eastern Maine Recycling (EMR) "for the disposal of Solid Waste through the use of the Southwest Harbor (SWH) Facility, and for the transportation of Solid Waste from the SWH Facility to Penobscot Energy Recovery Company (PERC), and to provide the Town with a Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) licensed Solid Waste disposal facility for the disposal of non-hazardous Solid Waste, Recyclable Items, Compostable Organic Waste, Wood Wastes, Construction and Demolition Debris, Bulky Waste, Scrap Metal, Tires, and Inert Fill".

26. To see if the voters of the Town of Cranberry Isles will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a five (5) month lease agreement in 2010 with the Roman Catholic Bishop of Portland, Maine for use of the church land on Joy Road in Northeast Harbor, Maine, for parking of residents of, and visitors to, the Cranberry Isles.
