PUBLIC NOTICE COVID -19 Health Emergency Effective March 20 Until Further Notice

A Public Health Emergency has been declared in the Town of Cranberry Isles with the following directive from the Cranberry Isles Board of Selectmen:

Year-round residents who are returning from trips off island for more than a day, as well as returning summer residents, are strongly encouraged to self-quarantine for two weeks and be fever-free for at least three days, per CDC recommendations. All residents and visitors are further advised to follow current US Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recommendations for limiting public gatherings and observing proper social distance. Unnecessary off island travel is strongly discouraged for island residents.

Contractors or others commuting daily to Cranberry Isles for work are strongly encouraged to remain on their jobsites while on island for work and maintain proper social distance from residents at all times, including limiting interactions with island residents.

Cari Alley, Health Officer for the Town of Cranberry Isles has advised that she will be providing public information and assistance by a variety of means as the situation warrants and as she is authorized as the Local Health Officer.

These guidelines are in effect March 17 Until Further Notice

The Cranberry Isles Board of Board of Selectmen will be hold regular follow-up meetings on Tuesdays and Fridays starting March 24, 2020 at 10am at the Town Office to further assess the situation as it evolves. Remote attendance will be made available for that meeting for anyone who wishes to attend. Contact information will be posted as we are looking into video conferencing as an alternative to teleconferencing.

Covid-19 Recommendations

- It is strongly recommended that ALL non-essential travel stop!
- It is strongly recommended that residents follow CDC's recommendation of social distancing, proper hygiene practices and sanitation practices.
- It is strongly recommended that businesses follow the Governor's ban on groups of 10 or more people indoors.
- It is strongly recommended that individuals selfquarantine for the CDC's suggestion of 14 days after any travel through areas where Covid-19 is spreading. Travel for this purpose is more than one day of movement. (Going to the grocery store and/or a doctor appointment and then coming home on the same day is not subject to self-quarantine at this time. BUT all other recommendations are in effect. Hand washing and social distancing).
