We have examined the report of the superintendent of schools, and approved the same. We believe we can reduce the appropriation this year in the different departments to an appreciable extent, without lessening the efficiency of our schools.

After careful study of the financial situation, we make the following recommendations for the ensuing year:

This represents a reduction of \$338.00.
