

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Cranberry Isles:

There have been two changes in the teaching force since the last report, viz: Mr. Guptill, Washington State Normal, Great Cranberry Island grammar, and Miss Smith, Washington State Normal, Great Cranberry Island primary.

Following is the number of pupils in each grade and also the number in each school.

Grade 1—3 boys, 4 girls.
2—4 boys, 2 girls.
3—1 boy, 4 girls.
4—0 boys, 5 girls.
5—5 boys, 2 girls.
6—7 boys, 7 girls.
7—0 boys, 1 girl.
8—5 boys, 4 girls.

Total—25 boys, 29 girls.

Islesford, 22 pupils; Great Cranberry Island, 32 pupils; a total of 54 pupils—a gain of 7 pupils from last year.

The pupils have been supplied with everything necessary and the work so far has shown a marked improvement in all the schools.

There are seventeen students receiving higher education in different schools of the State, as follows: Higgins Classical Institute, 5; Ellsworth, 3; Bar Harbor, 6; Bucksport Seminary, 1; Southwest Harbor, 2.

In closing, I wish to thank the Superintending School Committee and citizens for their co-operation during the year.

- 12 To choose by ballot constables for the ensuing year.
- 13 To choose surveyor of lumber and measurer of wood and bark for the ensuing year.
- 14 To choose by ballot road commissioners for the ensuing year.
- 15 To see if the town will vote to hold the next annual town meeting at town hall Great Cranberry Island.
- 16 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the development of Maine.

- 17 To see if the town will vote to accept the names of persons the municipal officers, treasurer and clerk have prepared for list of jurors.
- 18 To see what sum of money the town will vote to give the Islesford Wharf Co., for the upkeep of the wharf for A. D. 1928.
- 19 To see if the town will vote to authorize the assessors to look over taxable property.
- 20 To see what action the town will take regarding the proposition of the Bangor Hydro-Electric Co. as submitted to Moorfield Storey and act thereon.
- 21 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to take care of the above article.
- 22 To see what sum of money shall be raised for necessary town charges.
- 23 To see what sum of money shall be raised for the support of the poor.
