

# Notice to Taxpayers IMPORTANT!

ALL TAXPAYERS SHOULD READ THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS AND COMPLY WITH THEM

Section 70, Chapter 13, Revised Statutes of Maine, 1930

"Before making an assessment, the Assessors shall give seasonable notice in writing to the inhabitants, by posting notification in some public place in Town, or shall notify them in such other ways as the Town at its Annual Meeting directs, to make and bring in to them true and perfect lists of their polls and all their esteates, real and personal, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the first day of April of the same year. If any resident owner after such notice, does not bring in such lists, he is thereby barred of his right to make application to the Assessors or the County Commissioners for any abatement of his taxes unless he offers such lists with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to offer it at the time appointed."

#### SCHOOL REPORT

#### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Cranberry Isles:

I herewith submit my third annual report as Superintendent of Schools for the fiscal year ending January 1, 1950.

It is a pleasure to report that both the General School Fund and the Consolidated Statement show a favorable balance of \$907.26 this year. This was due principally to the reduction in our teaching staff, made last year when one teacher instead of two was hired for the Cranberry School. It will also be possible to make a further reduction in our budget this year of \$600.00 if only one teacher is hired for the Islesford School.

The Department of Education recently notified us that because of the failure of the legislature to raise the necessary funds, there would be a loss in State School Funds of approximately 10% in 1949, with a further reduction of 18% in 1950. The problem of meeting the loss in State School Funds will rest squarely in the hands of the towns and can be met by either reducing the school budget, which will result in a curtailed program, or by an increase in the school appropriation.

It is expedient, we believe, to point out that the State's failure to meet its financial obligations is not due to bills passed by the recent legislature to help education. State subsidies to help education were voted by previous legislatures, and the recent legislature without any advance warning to the towns—who had made up their budgets in December or January — refused to pass any new taxes in order that the deficit in State funds might be met. Therefore the local taxpayer must foot the bill. The loss in State School Funds amounted to approximately \$300. for Cranberry Isles.

Tuition, board and room costs have tended to increase this year. Not only do we have more children attending high school, but tuition costs have increased rapidly due to the new State law raising the limitations placed on tuition costs. We now have thirteen children attending high school, costing the town approximately \$1,970. in tuition charges. Last year we had eleven children attending high school, costing the town \$1,295. for tuition.

Decreasing enrollment in our schools during the last two years, has brought about a corresponding decrease in the number of teachers from four to three. If this trend continues, it will probably mean a further reduction in our teacher staff this year.

At the present time, we have two teachers in the Islesford School and one at Cranberry. The enrollment in the Islesford School has dropped to thirteen and with four graduating in the spring and only one entering next fall will decrease to ten. This trend will not change for the next two years, unless some families should move to the Islands. Under these conditions, it seems wise to reduce the teaching staff to one teacher.

The removal of one more teacher would mean a further reduction in the budget of approximately \$1,100. Teachers in the Islesford School now receive a salary of \$1,750 each. However, if only one teacher is retained for next year she should receive a salary of \$2,000., comparable to that received by the Cranberry teacher. Both teachers would then be teaching all grades, sub-primary to the eighth.

The estimated saving to the Town, over a year period, with two teachers would probably be as follows:

The window trimmings of the Islesford School were painted this past summer. However, it will be necessary to paint the exterior of the building this year. This work will probably be done sometime during the summer.

We have been very fortunate in this time of teacher shortages in having an excellent teaching staff in our schools this year. Mrs. Velma Teel is the teacher in the Cranberry School and Mr. Charles Hurlbut, Jr., teaches the upper grades and Mrs. Eva Moore the lower grades in the Islesford School .

To Hillis D. Bryant, a Constable of the Town of Cranberry Isles, in said County,

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Cranberry Isles, qualified to vote in Town affairs, to meet at the Neighborhood House, Little Cranberry Island, in said Town, on Monday, the sixth day of March, A. D. 1950 at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles to wit:

- Article 1. To elect by ballot a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
  - 2. To elect by ballot a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
  - 3. To hear and act on reports of Town Officers.
  - 4. To elect by ballot three Selectmen, who shall be Assessors and Overseers of Poor.
  - 5. To elect by ballot a Treasurer, and vote his compensation.
  - 6. To elect by ballot a Collector of Taxes, and vote his compensation.
  - To elect by ballot a Collector of Automobile Excise Tax, and vote his compensation.
  - 8. To elect by ballot one member of Superintending School Committee, for three years.
  - 9. To elect Constables for the ensuing year.
  - To elect by ballot, Road Commissioners for the ensuing year, and vote their pay.
  - 11. To elect by ballot, Surveyors of Lumber and Measures of Wood and Bark for the ensuing year.
  - 12. To see if the Town will vote to hold the next annual meeting at the Town Hall, Great Cranberry Island.
  - 13. To see how many teachers the Town will vote to employ.

14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for schools, under this joint budget to be accounted for separately.
