## RESULTS OF THE 2024 ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

## MARCH 16, 2024

The Annual Town Meeting was held at the Islesford Neighborhood House. There were 58 Voters in attendance. Denise McCormick, Town Clerk opened the meeting at 8:30 am.

The Articles were voted on as follows:

1 To elect by ballot a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Joseph Connell nominated Michael Todd. No other nominations.

6 Votes Cast, 6 votes Michael Todd.

2 To elect by ballot a Town Clerk for the ensuing year and to vote compensation.

Barbara Fernald nominated Denise McCormick

8 Votes Cast, 8 Votes Denise McCormick.

Jeri Spurling motioned to set the Compensation for the year at \$8,000, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jason Pickering Unanimous Vote to approve.

3 To see if the voters of the Town of Cranberry Isles will approve the use of the Maine Municipal Association's recommended Maine Moderator's Manual "Rules of Procedures" for the conduct of this Town Meeting.

Wendy Todd motioned to approve, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Theodore Spurling.

Unanimous Vote to approve.

4 To see if the voters of the Town of Cranberry isles will vote to approve opening the floor of this Town Meeting to all non-registered persons for the purpose of discussion only on each of the following articles of this 2024 Warrant.

Barbara Fernald motioned to approve, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Amy Palmer.

Unanimous Vote to approve.

5 To elect by ballot a Selectboard member for the term of 3 three years.

Richard Howland nominated Katelyn Damon.

Colleen Bunker nominated George Dickson

Jeri Spurling nominated Florence Joy Sprague. Joy declined the nomination.

There were 47 Votes Cast, 27 Votes Katelyn Damon, 20 Votes George Dickson.

6 To vote compensation for all Selectboard members for the ensuing year.

Wendy Todd motioned to set it at \$8,000 for chair and 7,500 for the others, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Theodore Spurling.

7. To elect by ballot a Town Treasurer for the ensuing year and to vote compensation.

Barbara Fernald nominated Denise McCormick.

Bruce Fernald motioned to set compensation at \$11,000 for the year, 2nd by Barbara Fernald.

8. To elect by ballot a Collector of Taxes and Collector of Excise Taxes for the ensuing year and to vote compensation.

5 Votes Cast, 5 Votes Denise McCormick.

Barbara Fernald motioned to set compensation at \$29,000 for the year, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bruce Fernald.

9. To elect by ballot a member of the Superintending School Committee for a term of three years.

Barbara Meyers nominated Cari Alley

Katelyn Damon nominated Hannah Folsom.

10. To vote the hourly rate of pay for Town Officials and Employees.

George Dickson motioned to set the rate at \$18 to 35, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Barbara Fernald.

11. To see if the voters of the Town of Cranberry Isles will vote to collect interest at the rate of eight Percent (8%) APR on all 2024 taxes not paid by December 01, 2024. Municipalities may, by vote, determine the rate of interest that shall apply to taxes that become delinquent during the taxable year 2024 until those taxes are paid in full. The maximum rate of interest that can be charged per Title 36, MRSA 505.04 is eight and one-half percent (8.5) APR.

This authorization will permit the Treasurer to prepare Financial Warrants for approval by the Selectboard, prepare checks and legally pay bills pending approval of the entire Operations Budget by the Voters in March 2025.

The School Committee recommends \$440,263 for additional local funds and gives the following reasons for exceeding the State's Essential Programs and Services funding model by \$440,263: The State funding model underestimates the actual costs to fully fund the 2024-2025 budget.
