

Notice to Taxpayers IMPORTANT!

ALL TAXPAYERS SHOULD READ THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS AND COMPLY WITH THEM

Section 70, Chapter 13, Revised Statutes of Maine, 1930.

"Before making an assessment, the Assessors shall give seasonable notice in writing to the inhabitants, by posting notifications in some public place in Town, or shall notify them in such other ways as the Town at its Annual Meeting directs, to make and bring in to them true and perfect lists of their polls and all their estates, real and personal, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the first day of April of the same year. If any resident owner after such notice, does not bring in such lists, he is thereby barred of his right to make application to the Assessors or the County Commissioners for any abatement of his taxes unless he offers such lists with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to offer it at the time appointed."



SCHOOL REPORT

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Cranberry Isles:

I submit, herewith, the annual report of the schools of this Town, with a statement of all receipts and expenditures for educational purposes during the year now ending.

As indicated by the financial report, we have closed the year with a general balance of slightly better than \$1,000.00. This, it may be noted, by comparison with the report of last year, is somewhat less than the balance carried over at that time.

Turning to the financial forecast for the ensuing year, we must emphasize again the trend toward higher costs in all phases of living. Every commodity purchased, from food to personal services, is costing much more today than a short time ago. Education, although a public enterprise, is nevertheless subject to the same economic laws of supply and demand as is any private enterprise. Teaching service, the greatest single item in the school budget, is at a premium now, and is becoming still more valuable with each passing month. The teacher shortage is extremely critical. Radio and press have emphasized this fact repeatedly, assuring us that the situation would not be improved for some time to come. Higher wages have attracted large numbers of teachers to other States. Many others have left the profession to seek employment in more remunerative industries. Enrollments of the normal schools have been dwindling, during the war years, as young people have found but slight attraction for teaching, with its extremely low salaries. Since it required three years to train an elementary teacher, it is only reasonable to conclude that the supply will be inadequate to meet the demands of Maine schools during the next two years, at least. As we have repeatedly stated, good teachers can find employment in the central and more accessible areas of the State. Most of them prefer to be on the main railroad and bus lines, and in the larger towns. Comparatively few will accept positions where travel difficulties exist, unless the wages and working conditions indicate definite advantage. Briefly, the problem resolves into one of two solutions: we must be willing to pay increasingly higher wages, or face the probability of being without teachers when school opens in September. The School Committee has given this matter careful consideration and has recommended an increased budget for the ensuing year. It will be necessary to appropriate \$2,600.00, the amount provided by the Town two years ago, for the support of common schools in order that adequate salaries be assured and teachers be available for the several positions.

Further increases will also be necessary for repair purposes. Among the items which should receive attention, first consideration should be given to the toilets at the Cranberry Isles school. These are extremely unsanitary and should not be continued in their present condition any longer than necessary. A water system, with an adequate supply for drinking and toilet purposes, would be an excellent addition to either school, but the cost at the present time would be unusually high. The chemical installation now in use should be replaced with some type, perhaps an ordinary vault toilet, next spring. Repairs are also needed on the entry door, and on several of the windows at the Islesford school. The Committee, after careful consideration of these several items, recommends that an appropriation of \$175.00 be made available for these purposes.

We feel that the schools of this Town have been fortunate in securing the services of good teachers during the past year. With many schools unable to open, and still others operating without their normal staff of teachers, pupils of this Town have been given the advantages of educational opportunity not available to all boys and girls. The teachers have worked for the interest of their pupils, and have at all times been conscientious and faithful to their assignments. We take this opportunity to express, to them, our appreciation of their work. To the members of the Superintending School Committee, who have given of their time and interest, we also extend our thanks, and an expression of appreciation for their essential contributions to the educational progress of the past year.

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Cranberry Isles, qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet at Town Hall, Great Cranberry Island, in said town, on Monday, the fifth day of March, A. D. 1945, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles

- Article 1 To choose by ballot a moderator to preside at said meeting.
 - 2 To choose by ballot a town clerk for the ensuing year.
 - 3 To hear and act on reports of town officers.
 - 4 To choose by ballot three selectmen, who shall be assessors and overseers of poor.
 - 5 To choose by ballot a treasurer, and vote his compensa-
 - 6 To choose by ballot a collector of taxes, and vote his compensation.
 - 7 To choose by ballot a collector of automobile excise tax, and vote his compensation.
 - 8 To choose by ballot one or more members of superintending school committee, one for one year, one for three years.
 - 9 To choose constables for the ensuing year.
 - 10 To choose by ballot, road commissioners for the ensuing year, and vote their pay.
 - 11 To choose by ballot, surveyors of lumber and measurers of wood and bark for the ensuing year.
 - 12 To see if the town will vote to hold the next annual meeting at Neighborhood House, Little Cranberry Island.

13 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for schools, under this joint budget, to be accounted for separately.

- 14 To see what sum of money shall be raised for necessary town charges.
- 15 To see what sum of money shall be raised for support of the poor.

- 17 To see what sum the town will appropriate for State-aid road construction in addition to amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, under the provisions of section 19, chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of chapter 213 Public Laws of 1941.

- 37 To see if the town will vote to elect a fire warden, according to section 6 of chapter 35 of the Revised Statutes of Maine.
- 38 To vote pay of town officers, labor and trucks.
- 39 To see if the town will vote to authorize the assessors to rescind any amounts appropriated by the town for Stateaid highway construction in excess of the amount required to meet State apportionments.
- 40 To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to sell and dispose of all tax titles held by the town on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quit-claim deeds for such property.
- 41 To see whether or not the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions, under the provisions of Chapter 5, Section 82, of the Revised Statutes. Said money to be expended through the State of Maine Publicity Bureau.

Note: The amount suggested is commensurate with what other towns in the state have appropriated for the Bureau during the past five years.

- 42 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
- 43 To vote pay of moderator for his services.

The selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of correcting the list of voters in said town, and hearing and deciding on applications of those claiming the right to have their names upon said list, at the Town Hall, Great Cranberry Island, in said town, at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.
